

"Strangers in a Strange Land - The Belgian Armoured Expeditionary Corps in WWI" - Military historian Dr. Paul Walsh recounts the remarkable odyssey of these Belgian troops who fought on the Eastern Front. After taking part in the Brusilov and Kerensky offensives, the Corps escaped revolutionary Russia via the Trans-Siberian railway, passing through China and the United States before returning home.

American Journalists in the Great War Author Chris Dubbs presents the story of American newspaper reporters who journeyed to Europe during World War I determined to provide their papers with news material on the war. "Ready to Serve - Unknown Stories of 64 WW1 Nurses" In 1917, Johns Hopkins Base Hospital 18 accompanied the first AEF troops "Over There" and immediately went into service in Northern France. The 64 nurses attached to the unit were all graduates of the Johns Hopkins School of Nursing. storyteller Professional Ellouise Schoettler draws on the letters of these remarkable women to recount their unforgettable experiences caring for the wounded and dying in this special oneperson performance piece.





"Commonwealth War Graves in the United States – Part 2"

Col. Nick Metcalfe (Ret.) delivers an update on his research project on British Commonwealth WW1 casualties buried in the United States. Recounting details of the lives of these individuals, and the circumstances of their deaths, Nick reveals many discoveries made researching these all-but-forgotten casualties of The Great War

WHERE: MD War Memorial Building, 101 N. Gay St., Baltimore, MD 21202.



<u>Parking:</u> 1) St. Vincent's Church, 101 N. Front St. (opposite the War Memorial across President St/ I-83 terminus) this is a free lot available to us on a first come, first served basis. 2) Impark Garage (15 Guilford Ave., Baltimore MD 21202) located just west of the War Memorial- weekend flat rate of just \$5.00, garage opens at 9AM.

Lunch: On your own; there are numerous restaurants in walking distance.

<u>Directions</u>: From the north, I-695 Baltimore Beltway to I-83 S into downtown Baltimore. At the end of the expressway, the War Memorial is immediately on your right. From the south, I-95 N toward downtown Baltimore, take exit 53, I-395 N. (Ravens Stadium will be on your left). Turn right at Pratt St., then left at Gay St.; the War Memorial is at the intersection of Gay and Fayette Streets.
